To limit COVID exposure from in-person voting, all registered voters will be sent an absentee ballot automatically. But you must be registered to receive a ballot.

WAYS TO VOTE: IN PERSON OR BY MAIL BALLOT

- In person on November 3rd at your local polling place
- Early in person at your county registrar of voters anytime before November 3rd
- Via USPS mail with a postmark on or before November 3rd
- At a county ballot drop box or county registrar of voters by 8pm 11/3/20
- Drop off your ballot at your polling place prior to 8pm 11/3/20
