- Public Health Offices on Story & King: Available February 17-19 from 10:00AM until 3:00PM at 1775 Story Rd, Suite 120. No reservations. Walk-ins served on a first come, first served basis. Registration starts at 9:30AM

Who's Next - Upcoming Vaccine Eligible Groups

- ✓ The Public Health Department has just issued new guidelines on which group will next be eligible for vaccinations after older adults aged 65+. The next group will be occupation based in the Phase 1B, Tier 1 Categories and include the following sectors:
- ✓ Agricultural and Food. Includes farm workers, food service workers, grocery workers, convenience store workers, etc.
- ✓ Education and Childcare. Includes teachers, daycare workers, other school staff, etc.
- ✓ Emergency services. Includes all emergency responders and private security workers.

The next group (beginning March 15) will be individuals aged 16-64 with severe health conditions. This group includes those at highest risk for morbidity and mortality from COVID-19 due to severe health conditions, such as cancer, type 2 diabetes, chronic kidney disease, heart conditions, severe obesity, pregnancy, and other high risk or developmental disabilities. Healthcare providers have been instructed to use their clinical judgment in determining eligibility for this group.

Dropping Contract Knowledge



The goal here is to inform members of the correct language AND intent of our Agreements, so workplace conditions <u>are not</u> broken down.

Tonight, will be about Pay Provision under Article 13 of the Master Labor Agreement.

We will focus on Paragraph 108

Master Labor Agreement (MLA) Article XIII Pay Provisions

108. PAY ON LAYOFF OR DISCHARGE:

A. When employees are laid off or discharged, they must be paid wages due to them immediately at the time of layoff or discharge in compliance with the California State Labor Code.

B. Employees terminated shall be released no less than one (1) hour before the end of their employment to report to the UA Local Union 393 Joint Hiring Hall for the purpose of registering for work and shall be paid for this hour or paid one (1) hour in addition to the hours actually worked.

C. If the employee is not on the jobsite at layoff then the employer shall notify <u>both</u> the employee <u>and</u> UA Local Union 393 that the payroll check shall be mailed the same day to the UA Local Union 393 Hall. Any disputes shall go to the Joint Conference Board.

Remember the goal is if the membership is informed and educated about the Contracts and Agreements then we as Local 393 together can *police* it, and we the Business Agents can *enforce* it, and not let conditions continue to *get broken down* on the jobsite!

Maurcio Velarde, Director of Compliance

It's been awhile since the last Mauricio Minute. So, I'll just reiterate what Mauricio does for UA Local Union 393. Brother Mauricio increases Market Share for our Contractors and our Members by going after cheating Contractors to keep a level playing field in order to keep our members working.

For example, the two (2) Contractors that Brother Mauricio went after in the past were Coastal Plumbing and Iron Mechanical. The lawsuits against these two (2) rat contractors that Mauricio filed; he also won. Since those lawsuits, they have not bid ANY Public Works jobs in Santa Clara County.

Mauricio has had an ongoing investigation and lawsuit against Pacific Plumbing for the last two (2) years. There was just a "Summary Judgment" hearing to dismiss the case last month brought by the Pacific Plumbing Attorneys and we won! We will now be going to trail on May 25, 2021.

Pacific Plumbing has been stealing work away from U.A. Members and Contractors for years. They have received 10's of millions of dollars of work, under the General Contractor Agbayani, just in Santa Clara County alone. But with Mauricio's hard work Pacific Plumbing is on their way to not working here is Santa Clara County just like Coastal Plumbing and Iron Mechanical.

Make sure to leave your First and Last Name, Last four numbers of your SSN, and what list you would normally sign, for example, A Fitter, A Plumber, A Welder or A Refrigeration.

For those who haven't been on the OOWL for quite some time, you have two (2) options to gain employment.

Attend Public Scoping Meeting and Claim PLA Work Assignments

Developers looking to build in Santa Clara and San Benito County start with an application for the development.

Once application is submitted, it is important that we, UA Local Union 393 along with the Building Trades Council are involved from the very beginning to assure it's built Union.

I will continue to attend these Public Scoping Meetings for new construction projects and follow the project throughout the process to the very end when UA Local Union 393 claims UA work assignments.

Qualified Rigger/Crane Signal Person Training

Large percentage of our work involves giving crane signals, rigging of pipe or equipment, and it is critical that rigging operations and signaling are performed safely by qualified UA members.

According to OSHA, rigging workers have been injured or killed when loads have slipped or the rigging has failed. That is why we must get trained!!!

OSHA Notes that Signal Riggers must be:

- ✓ Properly trained on the hazards associated with rigging jobs
- ✓ Qualified and able to comply with all procedures
- ✓ Familiar with rigging techniques and equipment
- ✓ Able to anticipate issues before they happen
- ✓ Aware of the weight of the load and the capacities of the crane and any rigging gear
- ✓ The Crane Signal Person must be Certified and Qualified

It is very important all Plumbers, Steamfitters, Welders, Refrigeration Techs and Apprentices are trained for Rigging and Crane Signals, and then get the experience on the jobsites.

Although Foreman and General Foreman cannot work with the tools, I suggest they also take these classes to assure everyone's safety.

Santa Clara County Negotiations



Yesterday, some of the Building Trades Council members and myself attended our first Fact Finding Meeting.

This is when during negotiations we have come to an impasse and negotiations have come to a stop, but not over.

We employed a Fact Finder and at this point is when we present facts and the County

Negotiation Team has a chance to rebut and present their facts. The good news about this is that the County Negotiation Team failed to show up in a good faith effort to continue negotiating a contract that has now been expired from November 1, 2020.

This is the point that we let the Fact Finder do their diligence and report their findings on our (393 and BTC) facts that we have provided, and move ahead positively and hopefully, swiftly to get this contract finalized with a recognition clause, wage percent increase, retro pay, proper job descriptions, and several other requests.



Next month I will be attending the UA Water Quality Program.

This program will be about Healthcare facilities and office buildings that are required to implement a water management plan to protect the building occupants. I'm sure you have all heard the saying, the "Plumber protects the Health of the Nation."

This seminar will also talk about the UA Water Quality Fundamentals that's designed to introduce

and inform about the risk assessment process for every piped system in every building. This will be important moving forward not only in a training type of setting but will also help with any type of future work.

For instance, when we can finally close an Agreement with Valley Water and any future PLA's. This program is fully being endorsed by the UA's own Executive Director Aaron Stockwell, International Representative Derrick Kualapai, International Representative Kurt Steenhoek, and more.

PLA Conflict

Just a quick update. I am working with our Local 393 Attorney to try and remedy a Breach of Contract before we go to Arbitration citing them for said breach. This really should be a open and shut case. But for some reason, I am getting push back even with a signed contract.

I'm confident this will be remedied, not only for myself but the Agents and Officers in 393 so we can continue to monitor our job sites and be granted access to job sites when required and not when convenient for site security.

This will also help other Union Crafts from facing these issues in the future.




